Led by Mr. Patrick Nip Tak Kuen, former Secretary for Constitutional and Mainland Affairs, the delegation arrived at Masjid Ammar and Osman Ramju Sadick Islamic Centre at 3p.m. on Thursday, 22 November 2018.

They were met on arrival by Bro. A.R. Suffiad, Chairman of the Union, Haji Saeeduddin, Vice Chairman and Haji Kasim Ma Fung Wai, Chairman of the Da'wah Committee.

The delegation were then escorted to the conference room on the seventh floor where they were briefed on the work of the Union by Bro. Suffiad and other Council members.

Among the delegation were Mr. Chan Tin Chu, District Officer, Wanchai, Mr. Stephen Ng Kam Chun, Chairman, Wanchai District Council and Dr. Jennifer Chow Kit Bing, Vice Chairperson, Wanchai District Council. The visitors were given a briefing on the work of the Union and showed keen interest on education and on classes organised for ethnic minorities particularly sewing, computer, handicraft and English classes.


World's smallest Qur'an found in China

The world smallest Qur'an was discovered in the Ningxia Hui Autonomous Region by archaeologist. The book is also described as the smallest book in the world measuring only 19.6mm long, 13.2mm wide. 6.1mm thick and weighs only 1.1grams.

found in Henan, Zhengzhou and it had been listed as the world's smallest book by Guinness World Records. This Qur'an is 25.708mm long, 19.517mm wide, 9.62mm thick and weighs 4.318 grams. It was printed about 200 years ago.

The book has a purple red hard cover, decorated with Arabic wordings to those who hold the Qur'an must be cleaned and is a Muslim. It was printed in the Muslim Calendar 1312 which was AD 1892.

Scholarships Presented To Deserving Students



Alhumdullilah! A ceremony held on Sunday, 16 December 2018 at which scholarships were awarded to deserving students of the Muslim community.

Organised by the Education Committee of the Islamic Union of Hong Kong (the Union) the function was held in the Seminar Room of Masjid Ammar and Osman Ramju Sadick Islamic Centre and attracted a large audience.

The event began with recitation of verses from the Holy Quran by Bro. Ishaa Ma, the Union's Da'wah worker. This was followed with a talk on "Islam and Modern Education" by Mufti Ibraheem Tufail after

which Bro. A.R. Suffiad, Chairman of the Union, presented awards to the

students.

Following presentation of the awards Bro. Suffiad presented a souvenir to Mufti Ibraheem. A Dua was recited by Imam Uthman Yang, Chief Imam of Masjid Ammar.

In his address to the gathering Mufti Ibraheem guoted Chapter 39 Verse 9 from the Holy Quran

which says "The one who does not have knowledge can never be equal to the one who has knowledge".

"No other religion stresses as much importance on knowledge as Islam does. IQRA' (read / recite) were the first words revealed to Prophet Muhammad" he said. "In the first few verses Allah clearly mentioned both religious knowledge and worldly knowledge comes from Allah. The only difference is that the former comes directly from Allah, revealed to Prophet Muhammad and is indirectly from Allah".

Mufti Ibraheem continued: "Allah taught humans how to read, write, and gave people the intellect to mould materials of this world for their own benefit. Prophet Muhammed freed enemy prisoners by fixing education as their ransom. If an enemy taught Muslims how to read or write, he would be freed by Prophet Muhammad".

Continuing his talk Mufti Ibraheem said: "An imbalance in knowledge exists amongst Muslims today. One group will study only "secular" knowledge and the other will study only religious knowledge. This approach by the Muslims can lead to many

issues and creates a gap in the Ummah. The way of Prophet Muhammad is the best way and it is the middle way. A balance between studying both secular and religious knowledge is important."

> A total of 66 students received the awards which came from four different funds with \$100,000 from Bokhary Fund: \$100,000 from the



Karim's Education Fund; \$60,000 from the Madam Yeung Lai Kwan's Education Fund and \$46,469 from the Imam Maulvi Ahmed Cheung Kwong Yee's Education Fund.

The amount of \$306,468 awarded in 2018 was higher than that of 2017 which was \$230,622.



A graduation ceremony was held on a Sunday


afternoon on the 7th-floor conference room.

IU Hockey Team Visited Laos

With the aim of encouraging as many young students as possible to improve their sporting skills and to boost their self-confidence, the Islamic Union of Hong Kong (the Union) sent its hockey team to take part in the "Annual Hockey Tournament" in Laos.

The tournament featured teams from Singapore, Malaysia, Laos, Thailand, Cambodia and Hong Kong and was held from 25 to 28 August 2018 in the Laotian capital of Vientiane. The Union's team came runners-up.

The trip was organized by the Sports and Recreation Committee of the Union with players and officials paying for their own expenses. But for students who had difficulty with financing

the trip, Bro. Kader Rahman was kind enough to approach Bro. Majid Bin Hassan who generously donated \$40,000 – a gesture much appreciated by the youngsters.

Bro. Hassan himself was a hugely talented sportsman who played various sports including hockey, lawn bowls, tennis and badminton. But it was in field hockey and lawn bowls that he particularly excelled representing Hong Kong in these events on several occasions.

In field hockey, he represented Hong Kong at the 1970 Asian games held in Bangkok, Thailand and again in 1974. In lawn bowls he represented Hong Kong at the 1978

Commonwealth games in Edmonton, Canada where he won the gold medal. Two years later in 1980 he represented Hong Kong at the World's Bowls Series held in Frankton, Australia again winning the gold medal. Participating in lawn bowls at the 1982 Commonwealth games Aberdeen. held in Scotland he won the bronze medal.

His support for and love of sports is deeply appreciated by many and the Union's hockey team eagerly look forward to his support in future.

The players were accompanied by a Hong Kong Hockey Association's qualified coach Bro. Kader Rahman who is himself a

keen hockey player having represented Hong Kong in the Tokyo Olympics in 1964. Bro. Rahman also represented Hong Kong in hockey at the Asian Games in Jakarta in 1962, Bangkok in 1966 and again in Bangkok in 1970.

Whilst in Vientiane the players enjoyed halal Laotian cuisine, performed their prayers in a small Mosque near the hotel, distributed zakat funds and old clothes to the poor and needy.

The Incorporated Trustees of the Islamic Community Fund of Hong Kong (Board of Trustees) started the relief and relief rehabilitation works for Rohingya people in Cox's Bazar, Bangladesh in September 2017 with the help of two Registered NGOs namely Markazul-Muslimen and Al-Markazul Islami. These two NGOs have been working in the affected area since the first group of Refugees arrived from Myanmar in a very poor condition.

The Islamic Union of Hong Kong is involved in the relief works since the beginning and has generously contributed a substantial amount to carryout relief works for the displaced Rohingya Refugees through the Board of Trustees. Al-Markazul Islami is the main NGO through which most of the relief works have been done. The organization was established in Bangladesh in 1988. They operate 16 Madrassas with 6,500 children who are receiving free Islamic education. They also provide food and shelter to orphans, build Mosques and small hospitals in various parts of Bangladesh.

Al-Markazul Islami informed Board of Trustees about the lack of medical facilities for Rohingya people and suggested to establish a medical clinic to provide medical treatment to the sick and injured Rohingya people as no such facilities were available nor the refugees are allowed to leave the camps. Board of Trustees discussed this suggestion with the Islamic Union of Hong





Kong and made a strong recommendation after which the Islamic Union of Hong Kong and its council kindly consented to establish a medical clinic cum small hospital and gave a generous donation of HK\$230,000/- in March 2018. The medical clinic formally started working from April 2018 and is equipped with the services of 2 doctors, 2 nurses, midwife, helpers, cleaners etc. as well as with supply of essential medicine. monthly operating cost ranges from HK\$55,000/- to HK\$70,000/- per month. In the beginning around 400 to 500 patients used to visit the clinic on a daily basis but now the daily number is around 200 to 250 patients. The clinic also provides labour/child delivery facility and 2 to 3 child deliveries/births take place every week.

The medical clinic is still functioning except for 2 months when the structure was damaged due to heavy rains and was rebuilt. The Islamic Union of Hong Kong has again donated HK\$300,000/-in different dates to keep the clinic in operation for the benefit of our Rohingya brothers and sisters. May ALLAH SWT Give AJAR-E-AZEEM



to all brothers and sisters who gave donations and the IUHK Council who allowed the collection of these donations.

Apart from running the medical clinic the BOT with the help of local NGOs has so far constructed 12 Masajid, 13 Madrassas, 43 water hand pumps, 3 deep water pumps in hilly areas, arranged marriage of 12 girls with house and financial assistance for each couple, constructed more than 600 homes & some small bridges. In addition to this around 5,000 blankets, 2,000 sweaters and 2,000 jackets were distributed among Rohingya brothers, sisters and children to help them cope with the cold winter season of 2017 & 2018. We have employed around 30 staff



including Imams, Quran teachers and other staff who are taking care of the Masajid & Madrassas and serving the Rohingya community by leading prayers and providing Islamic Education to children and elders.

By the grace of ALLAH SWT the relief works could only be successful and continue due to the financial help from the Islamic Union of Hong Kong and donations collected from Kowloon Masjid, Amsua Masjid congregation, many individual brothers & sisters and organizations. May ALLAH SWT accept the donations and hard work of all the people involved and reward them for this noble work, Aameen.



In conjuction with the Islamic Union of Hong Kong (the Union), the Islamic Association of Macau (IAM) recently organized a workshop for the Indonesian Muslim community in Macau.

Two speakers from Indonesia – Dr. Ahmad Satori Ismail and Dr. Rufah Abdullah - were invited to speak at this event. The Union was represented by Bro. Aminul Haque, Council Member, while IAM was represented by its Hon. Treasurer Bro. Ali Mahomed and Imam Ramadhan Ding the newly appointed Imam of Macau Mosque.

Dr. Satori is a Professor of Islamic Studies at the State Islamic University of Syarif Hidayatullah, Jakarta. Indonesia, while Dr. Rufah is a Senior Lecturer at the State Islamic Institute of Serang Banten, also of Indonesia.

In his address to the gathering, Imam Ramadhan reminded the audience to properly utilize the time that Allah has given them. "Indeed," said Imam Ding, "mankind is at a loss, except for those who have believed and done righteous deeds and advised each other to truth and to patience." (Qur'an 103)

In the first session, on "Keys to a Better Public Speech" Dr. Satori stressed that content in a speech is critical and consideration must be given to the audience when delivering the contents.

"Engaging with the audience keeps you connected and you won't feel alone." he said. "When you talk too quickly" he continued "you can wander off or make statements that have no relevance.



Additionally, the audience has trouble processing what you are saying."

He said that notes should be used as a guide and not as a script and advised the audience not to read word-for-word from slides, cards or notes. "This will bore the audience to death and usually result in sounding robotic." he said.

Dr. Rufah spoke on "The Role of Women in Da'wah". She said that from the very beginning, women played vital roles in the propagation of Islam. "From the sacrifices of Sumayyah to the collected hadiths of Aisha, women have been instrumental in spreading Islam. Da'wah amongst women deserves far more attention." she said.

In the third session, the topic of which was "Da'wah in a Workplace". Dr. Satori said that the best way to do da'wah is to plant a seed in a person's heart. The purpose of da'wah should not be conversion because having that goal will scare people away. Instead, by planting a seed, the person is left wanting more. "Let them know enough about Islam to interest them and Insha Allah, lead them to want to find out more when they are ready" he said.

He stressed that da'wah should be done through display of good character. He said the workplace is full of challenges and for those who work, they will come across rudeness, impatience and moody people. The only solution is to remain patient, smile



and avoid confrontation. Sharing and assisting others at work help others to warm and soften their hearts. When their hearts are attracted, then da'wah could be injected in them very easily.

In between the talks, sisters from Macau and Hong Kong performed nasheed.

Souvenirs were presented to the speakers by Bro. Ali Mahomed and Bro. Aminul Haque, and the event ended with a dua by Bro. Abdul Muhaemin bin Karim, the Union's Da'wah Worker, after which group photographs were taken.

Held on Sunday, 4 November 2018, the workshop was sponsored by Zakat House of the State of Kuwait and was held at the Kam Pik Community Hall attracting nearly 300 participants, an increase over that of the first workshop held in April 2018.

The 7th Guangzhou Islamic Culture Forum

On 30 December 2018, Haji Kasim Ma Fung Wai, Da'wah Committee's Chairman of the Islamic Union of Hong Kong represented the Union to accept the invitation of "The 7th Guangzhou Islamic Culture Forum" from Guangzhou Islamic Association.

The forum was held at Guangzhou Institute of Socialism, and the title of the forum was "Islam in

Guangzhou, Embracing Chinese Culture". More than 100 Chinese Muslim representaters attended on the day. By the fact that the ideas of Islamic culture have not yet been widely recognized or even distorted by the community, the purpose of this Forum is to promote how to communicate between the Islamic Community and the society, to make recommendations and ways to improve them.

Space for everyone? The Cambridge mosque project offers a new vision of community.



A recent article in The Economist lamented that in many of Britain's mosques women are excluded from leadership positions, with a large proportion of mosques not even accommodating women by providing space for worship. In a piece that appeared in The National, Shelina Janmohamed similarly levelled a critique of this phenomenon that is at once impassioned and bewildered. She asks: "If women are not able to join their friends and neighbours at the mosque, then where should they go? If they can't use places of worship to gain knowledge and discuss the issues of the day, to whom will they turn?"

At the same, there are several Muslim women serving as MPs in the House of Commons, as well as Baronesses within the House of Lords. On the other side of the Atlantic pond, two Muslim women have just been voted into Congress—and none of these women have denied their Muslim identities. Will the mosques catch up, one wonders?



I had the distinct pleasure recently of seeing the early stages of one of Britain's newest mosques in one of England's oldest cities, Cambridge. The mosque organisers, headed by a Cambridge University don in Islamic studies, Dr Timothy Winter otherwise known as Shaykh Abdal Hakim Murad — had clearly thought very carefully about the needs and requirements of this community. I am not familiar with many places of worship that send out opinion surveys as to what the mosque ought to provide in terms of services and spaces but this mosque did; including very specific questions, it seems, about the provision of space for female worshippers. This created, it appears, its own dilemmas — but it also allowed for the opportunity to be rather creative.

As one walks into the mosque complex, one immediately finds a cafeteria, teaching area and a garden. The mosque organisers reminded me that all of these were obviously gender inclusive, but that, additionally, the garden was designed by an English Muslim woman, Emma Clark, who trained at the Royal College of Arts. So far, so good. But the real question for Muslim women in places of worship is simple: does it allow for their empowerment in terms of space, or does it entrench their disempowerment in the same?

The answer to this question is answered as soon as one enters in the main prayer hall. There are three prayer spaces: the main hall; another, smaller hall separated from the main hall by sound-proof



transparent glass; and a balcony area above the smaller hall, from which the entirety of the main hall can be seen. The balcony is reserved for women; the smaller hall is reserved for women who might have crying babies, but who still want to be a part of the broader mosque community without feeling they might be bothering them with the infants' crying. The reserved "women-only" prayer spaces probably make up a good fifth of the overall prayer space. But that still leaves the main prayer hall.

A common topic of discussion in many mosques in the UK where there is provision for women is: do women have access to the main prayer hall and, if so, should there be a screen therein, separating the men from the women? The mosque organisers decided to ask the prospective community this question, in the form of a survey. Around 40% of respondents wanted a screen; the majority did not. So what was the mosque to do? Whom should the mosque try to satisfy?

The answer was easy: both. The mosque constructed arabesque screens that were a couple metres high for those who wanted to pray in complete seclusion, and screens that were about a half a metre high for those that did not. These smaller screens, nonetheless, functioned to demarcate the different spaces. Moreover, gaps



existed in between those sections, so that families who came to the mosque with children who might want to go back and forth between the men's and women's sections could do so easily. If that was not flexible enough, the screens themselves are movable, so that the space can be adjusted to accommodate more women should the occasion demand it. Such a simple solution to a potentially divisive problem is as elegant as it is ingenious.

Perhaps crucial for the success of this project will be the appointment of the Mosque Director at the Cambridge Mosque Trust — a position that, at present, is yet to be filled. On more than one occasion, the chairman of the Trust, Dr Winter, stressed that the position was gender neutral — both men and women were welcome to apply. He volunteered that information without any prompt from me.



This is a thrilling new project, and one that is well placed to welcome all sections of the Cambridge Muslim community. It is also a project that is designed to be accommodating to Cambridge's ecosystem: the mosque will feature solar panels, as well as rain-gathering (for use in maintaining the grounds) and water conservation (such as motion sensors near the taps in the ablution areas) measures. Consistently, I saw a mosque that was designed to bring the wider community — Muslim and non-Muslim alike — into the mosque grounds, and to a means of regenerating the local surroundings as a genuinely communal space.

One can only hope that the Cambridge mosque serves as a new standard in England, the UK and Europe more generally for mosque design. It still needs support, and for the good of social cohesion throughout Cambridge and Great Britain, I hope it receives all the assistance it needs.

5** DSE Muslim Student Encourages Non-Chinese Students Never Give up Chinese

The results of the 2018 Hong Kong Diploma of Secondary Education (DSE) was very impressive, among the top students is Nusky Shazia Syeda, a Hong Kong – born Indian Muslim. Nusky has achieved level 5** in five subjects and level 4 in Chinese language.

After graduated from Islamic Dharwood Pau Memorial Primary School, Nusky continued high school at Diocesan Girl's School. Recalling her Chinese language learning journey, Nusky said, "The Chinese language subject in my primary school was divided into two sections – for Chinese and Non-Chinese students. But I attended both. When I studied in high school, all subjects were taught in English except Chinese language subject, and the Chinese language subject in DSE level was very intensive."

Despite Nusky is a native Hong Kong people, she has no Cantonese speaking family members. The only opportunity that she can practice Cantonese was at school when she communicated with classmates and friends. "My parents always encourage me to communicate with others in Chinese, unfortunately when people noticed I am a non-Chinese, people spoke to me in English spontaneously." said Nusky.

Although Nusky admitted that for Non- Chinese students learning Chinese in Hong Kong is extremely difficult, she never think about giving up. "As a non-Chinese, we do not have a Chinese root, we are not familiar with the structure of Chinese characters, reading Chinese is very difficult for us." Therefore many non-Chinese students choose to give up learning Chinese because they cannot found motivation to continue studying.

"I am very grateful to my family, for their financial and spiritual support and to my teachers for their tireless nurturing. I did not attend private Chinese tutorial class because those classes mainly focused on examine paper answering technique. If I did not understand the basic well, attending more tutorial classes could only be in vain."

Nusky shared her Chinese language study tips with us.

1.The most important is doing extra papers besides regular homework.

2.Try to understand the background or origin stories of the Chinese idioms and classical Chinese pieces.

3.Do not shy to ask your school teacher to review your work after class.

Nusky obtained level 5** in DSE Chinese Paper 3 – Integrated Skills, she paid tribute to her teachers for their dedication and guidance. It is undeniable that the most difficult part of all the Chinese examine papers are "Classical Chinese" comprehension and Chinese composition. Nusky

is difficult because even one character can be used as different parts of speech such as noun, verb and adjective and carried different meanings. Composition is difficult because there is no fixed answer, different graders might have different expectation. Luckily, she did

explained "Classical Chinese"

not worry too much about her results after DSE was over.

She is now studying medicine year one at the University of Aberdeen in Scotland, UK. Nusky has noticed that the support to the non-Chinese patients under the current medical system is insufficient. She wishes to be a doctor and contributes in public hospitals in Hong Kong after graduating from university. Nusky wishes to help the ethnic minorities with her professional knowledge and language skills.

Nusky succeeded in DSE examine and able to continue pursuing her dream because of her perseverance attitude. "I have continued my Chinese study and have taken Mandarin class too. I want to be a good doctor, and it is important for doctors to be able to understand patients' needs, communication is essential." said Nusky. Last but not least, Nusky wants to say to those non-Chinese students who are studying Chinese and thinking about giving up. "Everyone can learn Chinese. Even though the road ahead for us is tougher than the Chinese people, when we can conquer the Chinese language, we will have a brighter future and better choices in careers."

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



A Public Talk on Islamic Perception on Environment and Sustainable Development

On Saturday, 8 December 2018 a public talk was held in the Seminar Room of Masjid Ammar and Osman Ramju Sadick Islamic Centre. The title of the talk was "A Bestowed Trust: An Islamic Perception on the Environment and Sustainable Development" and it was co-organized by the Centre for the Study of Islamic Culture, Chinese University of Hong Kong and the Youth, Education & Sports (YES) Committee, Islamic Union of Hong Kong.

Prof. İbrahim Özdemir, Head of Department of Philosophy, Uskudar University, İstanbul and currently a visiting scholar in Åbo Akademi University, Turku, Finland, was invited as the speaker of the talk. Prof. Lam Chiu Ying, Adjunct Professor, Department of Geography and Resource Management, CUHK and Former Director of the Hong Kong Observatory, was invited as the discussant. Prof. Lawal M. Marafa, Professor of Department of Geography and Resource Management, CUHK, was the moderator.

"Today, the world's greatest problem is not only environmental many of them in some way a byproduct of environmental problems. 

香港回教信託基金總會(基金會)於2017年9月在兩個已註冊的非政府組織Markaz-ul-Muslimen和Al-Markazul Islami的協助下,開始為孟加拉科克斯巴扎爾(Cox's Bazar)的羅興亞人提供救濟和救援工作。自從第一批難民從緬甸抵達後,他們的生活條件非常糟糕,而這兩個組織一直在當地開展工作務求改善當地生活環境。

香港伊斯蘭聯會從開始就參與當地的救援工作,並透過基金會為流離失所的羅興亞難民提供大量救濟工作。

Al-Markazul Islami是主要工作組織,大部份的救援工作都透過該組織完成。該組織於1988年在孟加拉成立。他們所營運的16間學校(Madrassas)中,有6,500名兒童正接受免費的伊斯蘭教育。他們還為孤兒提供

食物和住所,並在孟加拉各地建造清真寺和 小型醫院。

Al-Markazul Islami向基金會反映當地的羅興亞難民缺乏醫療設施,並向基金會建議設立一個醫療診所。因當地缺乏醫療設施,難民們亦不允許離開營地,設立醫療診所能為生病和受傷的羅興亞人提供在地醫療診所能為生病和受傷的羅興亞人提供在地醫療診所監查,並提出強烈建議,香港伊斯蘭聯會及其幹事會同意在當地設建醫療診所暨小型醫院,並於2018年3月據概地捐款230,000港元。醫療診所於2018年4月正式開始運作,配備2名醫生、2名護士、助產士、助手及清潔工等,並提供必需的至五、助產士、助手及清潔工等,並提供必需的五至,2000港元。診所開業初期,每日約有400到500名患者就診,至現在每天約有200到





250名患者到診所就診。該診所還提供分娩 設施,每週進行2至3次分娩手術。

醫療診所除了有2個月因大兩導致結構受損 須關閉重建外,均正常運作。伊聯會其後再 次捐贈港幣30萬元,以確保診所運作順暢, 為羅興亞兄弟姐妹服務。願真主賜福予所有 曾經捐贈的兄弟姐妹及允許收集捐款的伊聯 會幹事會。

除醫療診所外,基金會還在當地非政府組織的幫助下,迄今已建造了12間清真寺、13個教育中心、43個手動水泵、3個位於山區的深層水泵、安排了12個女孩的婚禮並為每對夫婦提供住房和經濟援助、建造了600多間房屋及小橋樑。除此之外,向羅興亞兄弟姐妹及兒童分發了大約5,000條毯子、2,000件毛衣及2,000件外套,以幫助他們應付寒冷的冬季。我們僱用了大約30名員工,包括教長、古蘭經教師和其他工作人員在清真寺人提供伊斯蘭教育進一步為羅爾亞社區服務。




屬於所有人的空間? 英國劍橋清真寺計劃,一個新的社區願景



英國的《經濟學人》週報最近刊登的一篇評論文章說,在英國許多清真寺,女性均被排除在領導層之外,大部分清真寺都沒有提供女性的禮拜空間。英國作家謝利納•賈穆罕默德(Shelina Janmohamed)在阿聯酋的新聞資訊網頁《The National》上登出的一篇文章中,同樣對這種現象進行了批評,這現像立刻受到大眾的關注。謝利納在文章中問道:「如果婦女無法在清真寺與朋友和鄰居一起禮拜,那麼她們應該去哪裡?如果她們不能使用禮拜場所,她們應從何處獲取知識並討論她們的問題,她們將成為怎樣的人?」

另一方面,在下議院有幾位擔任國會議員,以及上議院爵士的穆斯林女性。在大西洋的另一邊,兩名穆斯林女性剛剛被選入美國國會。這些婦女都沒有否認自己的穆斯林身份。或許有人想問,清真寺能趕上時代的趨勢嗎?





最近我在英國最古老的城市之一——劍橋——看到了英國最新的清真寺之一的早期建築階段。清真寺的組織團隊以劍橋大學的伊斯蘭研究講師提摩西•溫特(Timothy Winter)博士為首,他們非常謹慎地考慮了這個社區的需求和要求。以我所知,並沒有很多禮拜場地會發出有關清真寺應該提供什麼服務和空間方面的意見調查,但這間清真寺做到了,並且特別問到為女性信徒提供空間方面的問題。這似乎在為難自己,但它亦提供一個蛻變的機會。

當走進清真寺時,就會立即見到一個自助餐廳、教學區和一個花園。清真寺組織團隊告訴我,所有東西都具有性別包容性,值得留意的是,花園是由一位在皇家藝術學院接受培訓的英國穆斯林女子,愛瑪●克拉克(Emma Clark)所設計的。一切看起來都很好,但真正的問題其實很簡單:是否同意賦予穆斯林女性權力,抑或會進一步削弱她們的權力?



當走進禮拜大殿,問題就立即被解答。那裡有三個禮拜空間:主體殿、一個用隔音透明玻璃隔開較小的禮拜殿、在較小禮拜殿上方的樓廳,在那裡可以看到整個大殿。樓廳專供女性使用,而較小的禮拜殿則為那些帶著嬰兒、但仍希望成為清真寺一份子的女性預留,她們不需要煩惱嬰兒的哭聲會打擾別人。那個「女性專用」的禮拜殿佔整個大殿的五分之一,但仍然與主體禮拜殿分隔開來。

在英國許多有為女性提供服務的清真寺,均在討論的共同話題是:「女性是否可以進入主禮拜殿,如果可以的話,應否用幕帘將男性與女性分開?」組織團隊以意見調查形式向當地社區提出這個問題。 大約40%受訪者表示需要幕帘,大多數人則表示沒需要。那清真寺應該做什麼?應該滿足誰?

答案很簡單:兩者都可滿足。這座清真寺為那些 想要完全隔離的人建造了幾米高的阿拉伯式花紋幕 帘,而其餘的幕帘高度均約為半米,這些較小的幕 帘用於劃分不同的空間。在每個空間之間均有通 道,為帶著孩子來的家庭,提供可在男性和女性空間來回走動的方便。如果這不夠靈活,幕帘是可移動的,因此可以調整空間大少,以容納更多女性。這種對潛在分裂問題的解決方案,既簡單、優雅又巧妙。

或許對這個項目的成功關鍵,在於劍橋清真寺信託基金會所任命清真寺主任——這職位目前尚未填補。信託基金會主席溫特博士強調,這職位是性別中立的——歡迎男性或女性申請,他主動的補充這些資料。

這是一個令人興奮的計劃,一個非常適合的場地歡迎劍橋穆斯林社區的所有成員。而這更是一個旨在幫助劍橋生態系統的項目:清真寺將採用太陽能電池板;在收集兩水灌溉地面;洗手間水龍頭設有感應器可節約用水等。我一直覺得清真寺應該把社區層面擴展——穆斯林和非穆斯林——帶入清真寺,並將成為一個真正的公共空間。

希望劍橋清真寺將成為英國和歐洲的清真寺設計新標準,令它變得更普及。這個計劃仍然需要支持,為了劍橋以至整個英國社會的凝聚力,我希望它將得到所需的一切幫助。 (澳大利亞廣播公司)



世上現存最小的書:寧夏博物館藏《古蘭經》

寧夏博物館考古專家日前經過考證發現,收藏於寧夏博物館的一本《古蘭經》是世界上現存最小的《古蘭經》,也是最小的書。這本《古蘭經》 長19.6 毫米,寬13.2 毫米,厚6.1 毫米,重1.1

克。書封面由紫紅色硬牛皮紙作外裝飾,上面印

有民族圖案,扉頁上印着埃及國徽和阿拉伯文。經考證阿拉伯文意為:「這是尊貴的《古蘭經》,只有外清內淨的人才可以攜帶,伊曆1312 年。」伊曆1312 年即公元1892 年。

寧夏博物館副研究員何新宇 對記者說,「早前一本在河 南鄭州發現、被列為健力士 世界紀錄的『世界上最小的書』的《古蘭經》, 長25.708 毫米,寬19.517 毫米,厚9.62 毫米, 重4.318 克,約為200年前印刷。」而寧夏博物館

現存的這本《古蘭經》無論從尺寸還是重量方面,都比鄭州的《古蘭經》小得多,是故寧夏博物館收藏的這本《古蘭經》才是世界上現存最小的書。

這本《古蘭經》體形雖小, 但裝幀精緻,書中阿拉伯文 印刷非常清晰,字跡沒有任 何塗抹痕跡,不用放大鏡也 能看清內容。 香港仔



至於中文科,她於卷三綜合能力取

得5**,她指全靠老師的指導和操練。她認為中文科最難的是文言文部份和寫作,前者難處在於有很多不同

的譯法,後者難處在於不能掌握不同評 卷員的要求。她指過了四月後就沒有再 擔心成績,一直保持輕鬆的心情。

考取好成績的她得到外國學校的取錄, 修讀醫科,她指現時少數族裔在港的醫療支援不足,由於不懂廣東話往往未能 得到適合治療,她希望將來成為公立醫

司路芝同學小學就讀於伊斯蘭鮑伯濤紀念小學,該校的中文課程分為華裔及非華裔,兩種課程司路芝同學均有修讀。直至升讀拔萃女書院後,除中文外均以英文修讀。現在於蘇格蘭(Scotland)的亞伯丁大學(University of Aberdeen)修讀醫科。

司路芝同學表示,雖然她是土生土長的香港人,但其實家裡除了她之外,沒有其他家庭成員會講中文,她只有在上學與同學及朋友溝通時講中文。雖然家人都不懂中文,但她的父母很鼓勵她用中文與人溝通。她表示,雖然平常很想與人用中文溝通,但很多時候人們因為她的外表,就會不自覺用英文與她交談,很難找到機會練習中文會話。

在中學學習中文的困難之處是她本身沒有中國人的文化知識背景,中文字的構造與她熟識的其他文字很不同,有時候讀起來會感到十分吃力,而且中文的造句文法、成語甚至於文言文,都是她從沒接觸過的,無形中令她感到無比壓力。而在眾多困難處之中,非華裔生感到最艱難的是,他們很難找到學習中文的動機,當要面對重重困難的時候,他們很容易就會放棄,難以找到堅持的動力。

司路芝同學感到慶幸的是得到家人的支持,無論是經濟上還有精神上。父母對她的中文成績從來沒有給過壓力,更沒有強迫她選擇修讀中文。另一方面,她沒有參加課外中文補習班,因為她覺得補習只是改進答

題的技巧,若果自己連基 礎知識都未能掌握到,就 算更多的補習也是徒然。

她學習中文的心得是在學校的功課以外,多做其他作業,嘗試理解中國成語及文言文的背景故事,細心研究每個字再翻譯、組合和理解,課後亦會找老師幫忙批閱,所幸的是,她的老師明白她的需要,會額外抽時間批改她的課外作業,更會指導她出錯處在哪。

司路芝同學指,懂得多一種語言是一個優勢,在香港生活,與本地人溝通時,如果能以中文溝通就可以更清楚傳遞到達意的訊息。她的志願是成為醫生,而醫生的工作須要聆聽病人需要及清楚溝通,懂多一種語言就會更容易把工作做好,她現在甚至開始學習普通話。

原來文憑試前,司路芝同學對自己中文信心不大,取 得成績後才發現其實自己也不差,慶幸當時沒有放 棄、盡全力學習中文。她更認為文憑課程的深度及學 習方式,對她現在修讀醫科亦很有幫助。

最後,她想對正在學習或想要放棄的同學們說,其實任何人都可以學懂中文,雖然過程會比身邊的華裔朋友困難得多,但只要克服到,將來的成果無論是對社會、對個人求職都會有更多、更佳的選擇。希望非華裔同學們可以一起努力以赴。

澳門印尼穆斯林社區工作坊

香港伊斯蘭聯會(伊聯會)最近聯同澳門伊斯蘭會(IAM)在澳門舉辦了一個印尼穆斯林社區工作坊。活動邀請了兩位來自印尼的演講嘉賓,Ahmad Satori Ismail博士及Rufah Abdullah博士。而伊聯會由夏萬盧兄弟及IAM馬雅歷兄弟代表出席活動,澳門清真寺丁少杰教長也應邀出席。

Satori博士於印尼雅加達的沙立夫◆喜達雅都拉國立伊斯蘭大學擔任教授,而Rufah博士則於印尼萬丹省西冷國立伊斯蘭學院擔任高級講師。

馬雅歷兄弟在致詞時對科威特天課署給予此活動的慷慨贊助表示感謝。他又向印尼兩大穆斯林組織MATIM及HALIMAH為是次活動成功舉辦所付出的努力表示謝意,又特別鳴謝Satori博士及Rufah博士蒞臨演講,期望這次工作坊能為澳門的穆斯林社群帶來希望。

丁少杰教長在致詞時提醒參加者要正確地使用真主給予的時間。「以時光盟誓,一切人確是在虧折之中,惟信道而且行善,并以真理相勸,以堅忍相勉的人則不然。」(《古蘭經》103)

活動的第一環節以「公開演講的關鍵」為題目,Satori博士強調,演講的內容至關重要,在帶出內容時,必須考慮到聽眾的感受。 「與觀眾互動讓你與他們保持聯繫,並且不會感到孤獨。若你說話的速度太快,你將會失去觀眾的注意力,甚至跑題;再者,如果你說話太快,觀眾很難接收到你所講的內容。」 Satori博士又指,筆記只能用作演講的指南,不建議講者從幻燈片、卡片或筆記中逐字逐句讀出來,「這樣會令觀眾感到很沉悶,並且聽起來很像機械人。」

於第二環節,Rufah博士的演講題目為「女性在宣教中擔當的角色」。她在演講開始時表示,女性在宣教方面發揮了至關重要的作用,「從素麥亞(Sumayyah)的犧牲到阿伊莎(Aisha)收集到的聖訓,女性在宣教上發揮了重要作用。女性在宣教方面的地位值得更多關注。」

第三環節的題目是「在工作中宣教」,Satori博士指,宣教的最佳方法是在人們心中埋下種子。宣教的目的不應該是改變他人的信仰,一旦有了這個目的,就會把人嚇跑。相反,在對方心中埋下種子,隨時間過去,對方就會越來越想知道更多,「讓他們知道足夠的資訊,對伊斯蘭產生興趣,從而引領他們尋找更多。」



他強調,宣教應該通過展示良好品格來進行,他指現今的工作場所充滿挑戰,那些工作的人會遇到態度粗魯、沒耐性和喜怒無常的人,解決方法就是保持耐性、微笑並避免衝突。在工作中分享和協助他人可以令他人感到你的溫暖並軟化他們的心。當他們的心被吸引時,宣教也變得輕而易舉。

在演講之間,澳門及香港的姐妹團朗誦了讚聖詩。馬雅歷兄弟及夏萬盧兄弟向演講嘉賓贈送紀念品,於活動尾聲,伊聯會的宣教主任穆海明兄弟念祈禱詞。之後所有參加者與來賓拍攝大合照。

2018年11月4日,由科威特天課署贊助的工作坊在澳門金碧文娛中心舉行,接近300人參與,比2018年4月份首次舉辦的工作坊,參與人數有顯著上升。



什。麼是伊斯蘭

七世紀初,伊斯蘭在阿拉伯半島興起,在23年間傳遍了整個半島,之後,繼續向外傳播,在隨後的幾十年間傳播到亞歐非三大洲,再後來傳播到世界各地。目前,據不完全統計,全世界大約有16億人口信奉伊斯蘭,57個伊斯蘭國家。伊斯蘭不只是一種宗教,而是一種社會制度,一套完整的生活方式。那麼,什麼是伊斯蘭?

從字面上講,伊斯蘭是阿拉伯文(AL-ISLAM

穆斯林 (AL-MUSLIM السلم) 一詞也是阿拉伯文 的音譯,是從伊斯蘭(一詞派生出來, 是主動名詞,從字面上講,意思是順從的人,追 求和平的人。從廣義上講,宇宙萬物都按照真主 所制定的規律運行,都要順從真主的定制,也就 是說都是順從者都是穆斯林。正如真主所說:「 難道他們要舍真主的宗教而尋求別的宗教嗎?同 時天地萬物,不論自願與否,都歸順祂(真主) ,他們將來只被召歸於祂。」(《古蘭經》3 :83) 從術語上講,穆斯林是信奉伊斯蘭的人, 是誠信並接受真主啟示給穆罕默德(願真主賜 他平安與吉慶)的全部律法和教義的人,也就 是說是順從真主的人、平安的人、和平的人。 伊斯蘭作為宗教名稱的由來,它既不是以任何 人的名字命名,也不是任何人命名的,而是真 主命名的,它來自《古蘭經》的明文,真主 說:「今天,我(真主)已為你們成全你們的 宗教,我已完成我所賜你們的恩典,我已選擇 伊斯蘭做你們的宗教。」(《古蘭經》5

:3)因此,伊斯蘭不 是人創立的,是真主的 啟示的,是真主的宗 教。真主說:「真主 所喜悦的宗教,確是



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伊斯蘭。」(《古蘭經》3:19)

聖訓中更進一步闡述了什麼是伊斯蘭,從下面 這段聖訓我們將會明白是真主命令大天使吉布 利勒來教授人們伊斯蘭的,伊斯蘭的信仰、教 義、功修都是真主啟示的。由歐麥爾·本·汗 塔布傳述,他說:「有一天,正當我們和真主 的使者坐在一起的時候,突然,一個身穿潔白 衣服,頭髮烏黑的人出現在我們面前。一點看 不出他身上有旅行的跡象,我們當中沒有一個 人認識他。他直接坐在穆聖(願真主賜他平安 與吉慶)面前,雙膝對著穆聖(願真主賜他平 安與吉慶)的雙膝,他把雙手放在穆聖(願真 主賜他平安與吉慶)的雙膝上,他說:『穆罕 默德(願真主賜他平安與吉慶)啊!請你告訴 我什麼是伊斯蘭?』真主的使者說:『伊斯蘭 就是你作證:萬物非主,唯有真主;默罕默德 (願真主賜他平安與吉慶)是真主的使者;履 行拜功,繳納天課;封萊麥丹月(伊曆九 月)的齋戒;如果你有能力旅行,應朝覲 天房。』他說:『你說對了。』」歐麥爾 說:「我們都對他既提問又回答肯定感到 很驚奇。(好像是在明知故問)他又說: 『請你告訴我什麼是伊瑪尼(信仰)? 』穆聖(願真主賜他平安與吉慶)說:『 你歸信真主,和他的天使、經典、使者末 日,以及善恶的前定。』他說:『你說對 了。』接著他又說:『請你告訴我什麼是 伊哈薩尼(至善)?』穆聖(願真主賜他 平安與吉慶)說:『伊哈薩尼(至善)是 你崇拜真主,猶如你看見他一樣,儘管你 沒有看見他,他確實看見你。』他又說:『 請你告訴我復生日什麼時間到來?』穆聖 (願真主賜他平安與吉慶)說:『被問者 不比問者更知道。』他說:『那麼,就請 你告訴我末日的徵兆吧!』穆聖(願真主 賜他平安與吉慶)說:『婢女將生出自

真主是宇宙萬物的主宰,天地之間所有的一切 都是真主創造的,真主是全人類的主宰。《古 蘭經》首章開端章(法諦哈)第一節經文:「 奉普慈特慈真主的尊名 | 開宗明義闡明了,真 主至高無上,真主的仁慈遍及一切被造物,在 審判日,真主特別恩賜信主且行善的人們。第 二節經文:「一切讚頌全歸真主,眾世界的 主。」此節經文闡明了真主是宇宙萬物的養育 之主,真主掌管養育眾世界。人類同根同源都 是阿丹的後裔,真主說:「眾人啊!你們當敬 畏你們的主, 祂從一個人創造你們, 祂把那個 人的配偶造成與他同類的,並且從他們倆創造 許多男人和女人。」(《古蘭經》4:1)穆 罕默德聖人(願真主賜他平安與吉慶)說:「 你們都是阿當的後裔,阿丹來自泥土。」因此 說,人類是一個大家庭,人類是一家,人與人 之間的關係是人類兄弟姊妹般的關係。

伊斯蘭是眾使者,眾先知的宗教。真主說:「 祂(真主)已為你們制定正教(伊斯蘭),就 是祂所命令努哈(挪亞)的、祂所啟示你(穆 罕默德)的,祂命令易布拉欣(亞伯拉罕),穆薩(摩西)和爾撒(耶穌)的宗教。你們應當謹守正教,不要為正教而分門別戶。」(《古蘭經》42:13)也就是說,阿丹(阿當)是穆斯林,努哈(挪亞)是穆斯林,易布拉欣(阿伯拉罕)是穆斯林,穆薩(摩西)是穆斯林,爾撒(耶穌)也是穆斯林。也就是說,所有順從真主,遵循正教的,都是穆斯林。

穆罕默德(願真主賜他平安與吉慶)是真主派遣的最後使者和先知,真主說:「穆罕默德(願真主賜他平安與吉慶)不是你們中任何男人的父親,而是真主的使者,和眾先知的封印。真主是全知萬物的。」(《古蘭經》33:40)

穆罕默德(願真主賜他平安與吉慶)是全人類的聖人,真主說:「我只派遣你為全人類的報喜者和警告者,但世人大半不知道。」(《古蘭經》34:28)真主派遣穆罕默德(願真主賜他平安與吉慶)是為了憐憫眾世界,真主說:「我派遣你,只為憐憫眾世界。」(《古蘭經》21:107)

綜上所述,真主是宇宙萬物的創造者、掌管者、主宰者,伊斯蘭是真主喜悦的宗教,是全人類的宗教。真主說:「誰尋求伊斯蘭之外的宗教,絕不被接受外,他(她)所尋求的宗教,絕不被接受例》。 (她)在後世,是虧折的。」(《古蘭經》3 :85)當然,宗教信仰自由,真主說:「對於宗教,絕無強迫;因為正邪確已分明了。誰不信惡魔而歸信真主,誰確已握住堅實的,絕不斷折的把柄。真主是全聽

的,是全知的。」(《古_

蘭經》2:256)
